Program Presentation: Carolyn Huston

Carolyn Huston is the President of BHBL Special Education Parent Teachers Association. She is also the mother of an autistic son. She gave some statistics indicating that the numbers of special needs students have been increasing and in the BHBL schools as well as all schools. Helping parents find information and resources for a child with a disability is challenging. Currently there are 70 members in the Special Education PTA.



Carolyn has written and produced 11 books for children and adults with illustrated stories about living with a disability. Many of the books show local people and local places.

She described several programs which involve students of all abilities.

- Besties the pairing of a high school or middle school student with a younger student with special needs to help the younger student participate in after school activities, athletic events, music events or any extracurricular activity.
- PALS the pairing of a student with a special need with a general education student in the same grade to hang out with during lunch, on field trips, at recess, or other activities.
- Guest speakers and program presenters on topics such as guardianship issues, Special needs Trusts and ABLE accounts, paths to graduation and parent to parent programs are being planned.

Because individuals with a disability or a parent of a child with a disability have trouble trying to gather information, materials, and resources that will enable them to live life to the fullest.... Carolyn is working with SEPTA to host a Special Needs Resource Expo on Saturday, March 28 at O'Rourke Middle School. The event will run from 11-2 pm. The goal is to host at least 50 vendor tables. The event will be promoted through all Capital Region school districts and NYS Regional PTA. The event should provide for great networking for all attending. A directory of the of exhibitors and sponsors will be prepared for distribution. Spartan Catering is participating with box lunches for preorder.
