### A BLACK LIFE LIVED WELL

#### Trent Griffin-Braaf

Trent and mother moved from the Bronx to Schenectady when he was eight to be closer to her family. She had issues with addiction. His absent father suffered with HIV/AIDS. He fitted in with his community and the Schenectady Public Schools where he enjoyed playing basketball, going on to state championships. He fell in with bad companions after high school, sold narcotics, was tried, convicted and sentenced to four years in state prison. The experience had good effects. He received stern discipline, avoided the bad influences which could have hardened him into criminality, took the classes offered by Marist College to the prisoners and developed the motivation needed for success following early release after three years served.

The lesson learned, Trent avoided the easy-money temptations of the street, taking the entry-level job of houseman with a Marriott hotel. With a cheerful personality and mentoring from a fellow employee he learned the front-desk job and worked his way up the management ladder, eventually to general manager. He moved from the Marriott to a Mallozzi hotel in Schenectady, sharpening his business skills, developing contacts and networking along the way.

Trent saw a need for transportation for poor people in the area. Bus service is limited in routes and schedules making it difficult to get to work, education and health care. He founded the Tech Valley Shuttle to fill the need. After he entered the transportation business, the ride-sharing services Lyft and Uber came along tending to take his clients. In response he changed his focus from individual to work transportation. He takes family members to prison visits, has transported food during Covid-19 and has helped ex-offenders get to work. He recently founded a new business to deliver orders from the Amazon.com Colonie warehouse.

Many questions were raised and answered covering topics like male mentoring and role-modelling, the high-school to prison pipeline, the BLM movement, prison-system improvements, etc. Trent was urged to join a Rotary Club. . . preferably BHBL.
