Brookside Museum Jere Blackwelder

Fellow Rotarian from the Ballston Spa club, Jere Blackwelder spoke to our club over Zoom about the Brookside Museum in Ballston Spa.

The museum is the home of the Saratoga County Historical Society who cares and maintains for the museum building and grounds. Built in 1792 as a resort hotel, Brookside has a long history of serving people. Among the oldest hotel buildings still standing in the United States, Brookside's history is as diverse as the people who visited here. At one time a boys' school, the building has also been a private residence, a boarding house, a sanitarium, and apartments. In 1970, the Saratoga County Historical Society purchased the building and opened it as a museum. Ever since, Brookside has been preserving Saratoga County's unique history.

Jere talked about the museum's need to reinvent itself during this Covid pandemic. They have been able to put a lot of exhibits online and started ongoing online programs, including one called Experts Next Door which talks about a range of topics from Beer Making History, Herb gardening, and Historical Preservation. An upcoming talk will focus on the history of Stewart's shops and the County Store.

They are also looking at having the museum and SCHS become a resource center for other historical societies and anyone needed historical resource help in the county and local area.
