District Membership and Training Drive – Jonathan Costolo



Recently some of our club's membership committee members attended a District Membership training meeting and brought back the information and training they learned to the club.

Past President Jon Costolo led the presentation and reflected on the importance of membership. He showed a video of Rotary International President Barry Rassin talking about membership.

Membership is the heart and

backbone of Rotary and without a plan to grow our membership our impact in the community and in the world is diminished. It is the diverse membership that brings new ideas and leadership to Rotary International. Impact starts with our members - people like us who see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.

Our District which is made up of 41 clubs is hovering above 1,100 members. This number is critical as it is the minimum required by RI to maintain a status as a district. If unable to increase our membership then our district may be combined with a sister district next to us. Merging districts can be a needed thing but it also would mean a larger area of responsibility and more clubs to distribute and divide funds to cover grants, operations, etc.

The District is all in to grow our membership. It has hired a local Professional Sales Consultant to give training to the membership committees of all the clubs in our district. Jon took this training and presented what he learned to the club. This presentation will be emailed out with this Rotateller for review. The basic premise is that we all have to be involved in growing our membership in the club and district. And that we must have the right attitude, the right behavior and the right technique to be successful in recruiting new members. The District will be doing a Membership Drive starting in Feb. and continuing through April.
