Fund-Raising Brain-Storming Session

The club's fund raisers provide the money needed for our support of charitable organizations in our community. Our pre-Covid events involved food service, large groups and close proximity of people. Ideas for Covid-compatible events were presented by President Gregg and discussed by the group. Gregg and his committee will review and come back to the club with more specific proposals.

<u>Bottle Collection</u>. Return of deposit bottles provides no-cost income. Concern was expressed about taking an income source away from other groups who may have established programs.

The <u>Chicken Barbecue</u> was introduced last year as a successor to the Rotary Breakfast. Spartan Catering has expressed interest in continuing. Details for pre-ordering, curbside pickup and cashless payment would need to be worked out. Excess inventory could be a major issue! Time of the week and year and location would need to be worked out.

The Golf Tournament is in planning now for 29 August with a rain date of 12 September. Steve Caine is at the helm.

Jon Costolo is working on the conversion of the <u>Apple Run</u> from a controlled to virtual event. Participants could register with Rotary, run (or walk) at their convenience, report to the club, turn in their pledges, receiving a tee shirt and completion certificate in return. There was considerable discussion regarding tee shirt procurement while avoiding overstock.

Gregg suggested a "Run 5, Donate 5, Nominate 5" event, involving no cost, no shirts and all profit.

Can the <u>Apple Pie Festival</u> be reinvented to be suitable for Covid? The District has raised money with a <u>Barrow of Booze</u> event. The booze is donated, tickets are sold and the barrow load goes to the winner of a drawing. Might our club adapt this?
