# **REVIEW OF THE MOST RECENT BOARD MEETING**

Finance: The 2020/2021 budget was voted on and approved.

<u>Mike – Membership</u>: Mike reported on the campaign to reach out to members who are not attending zoom meetings. The YMCA corporate membership has been discontinued. Rey mentioned speaking with Dr. Joe who says loves Rotary but that he is overwhelmed with high numbers at the dentistry and two children being schooled virtually at home. Mike noted that we must recognize that as club demographics change our service and fundraising may need to change as well.

**Darleen – Fundraising**: The district is offering "EVENT GROOVE" as a fundraising platform that will allow us to manage our fundraisers and increase success by giving electronic support to all events with ticket purchasing and much more. It

opens up the reach beyond our immediate community.

Jon – Fundraising: The Fall Apple Walk/Run Update: The start and finish dates will be announced soon. Members will walk/run and keep a tally of their total millage on their own. T-shirts are designed. He will order them only for those who actually register for the event, with a 2-week delay for delivery. Zippy online registration will go live this week. The cost to participate will be about \$23 and includes a neat, new Apple Run T-shirt.

<u>Mike – Fundraising: Polar Plunge</u>: Who and where? Many ideas have been discussed. Decisions are yet to be made.

Mary – Town in Bloom fall cleanup Sat. Oct. 17 starting at 8:30 a.m.at the North sign and at 9 a.m. at the Barrels – ALL HANDS ON DECK! Ken, Bill W. and others will remove the plants in the barrels. They and others will also remove about half of the soil in each of the 7 barrels. Bring buckets. Gregg will bring a quantity of buckets. This will be used to create two \$500 new scholarships to be given to students with associations with fire departments in Schenectady or Saratoga Counties.

#### **INTERACT updates:**

Mary reported that Interact has donated \$500 to a local family whose mother died of cancer as they needed money for funeral expenses.

Interact is also working on a campaign to raise money and collect Walmart gift cards for Thanksgiving and Christmas this year instead of having a food drive. In addition, Interact is working on donating craft supplies to Albany Medical Center's Children's Unit.

## INDIAN MEADOWS PAVILLION:

Silas reported that he is working on getting younger folks involved..."workforce" kids. The Town of Glenville will be grading the site during the next two weeks.
