## **Reverend Patrick J. Rooney STS**

Paddy is an active member of the Rotary Club of York and a past District Governor for District 7390. He began by highlighting his Rotary trip to India where he spoke at two Rotary Clubs & explained that the Rotary projects such as providing wells, toilets and exterior lighting have a significant impact on the local communities' standard of living.

He then discussed Rotary International's Vision Statement: "Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change across the globe, in our communities and in ourselves." A vision statement is internal to an organization which articulates their dreams & hopes for the organization. Said in another way, the vision statement answers the question, "Where do we want to go." This is different from a mission statement which "tells the world what they do & how they do it."

We are divided in many ways by race, creed, ethnicity, belief, gender, age or sexuality. We have further divided ourselves into subgroups which have created a source of dissention among ourselves. Our vision statement begins with the word "Together" which does not mean we ignore the differences between us but that we intentionally set them aside and figure out ways to work together. Our willingness to set them aside make us able to achieve our Rotary goals, serve our communities or help change the world.

In December 1968, 52 years ago, Apollo 8 circled the moon and brought back pictures of the earth now known as the blue marble. This was the first time anyone could see our whole planet from a distance.

This is the only world we have at least for now and we have the responsibility to take care of it. The beauty of our world is marred by poverty, hunger, the daily difficulty of living, wars, conflicts, & disasters. Although not easy, Rotarians respond to help resolve these problems with projects, some large & worldly like ending polio and some small like clearing trash & planting trees in our local communities. We live in world of constant change. We use change to create something better, something wonderful so that our World, our communities and we ourselves are better for it. Every change is a challenge, every challenge is an opportunity and we should seize those opportunities and make them something wonderful.

Patty offered some thoughts on membership. He suggested that we should assign new members to an ongoing project rather than to a committee. We should think outside of the box for recruitment ideas. Maybe we should have a less formal structure to some of our meetings. This would encourage communication between members & increase productivity concerning Rotary activities.
