MOXXI WOMEN'S FOUNDATION — Leslie Swedish

Leslie Swedish is the Executive Director of the Moxxi Women's Foundation and the owner of Moxxi Coffee Company on which the foundation is based. She defines Moxxi as a force of character, determination or nerve – also as tenacity of purpose, grit, bravery and resilience. The coffee company offers blends as unique as you are – woman owned – small batch craft coffee. For every item sold it contributes \$1 to the Foundation to invest in ambitious women who are the champions of their own story by issuing grants and other initiatives.

Leslie has been a real-estate agent and a tattoo artist in the past, often competing against men with stronger resources. Her life experiences have led to her to seeking ways to help other wormen make their way in their worlds. The Moxxi Womens' Foundation was the result.

Through grants and other initiatives, monetary support and networking opportunities needed to further transform their lives and help them reach new heights are provided. Financial help is in the form of micro grants of up to \$1000 and occasional larger grants of up to \$10,000. Recipients are typically women launching small businesses and artists starting out. One aspiring athlete was assisted. The information required for small grants is pretty simple. Many more questions are asked at the \$10,000 level.



In addition to funding from the coffee company, grant money is raised through membership in the foundation and from sponsors.

Leslie went through difficult times in establishing the coffee business, had had no board experience herself, but created a 501(c)(3) non-profit foundation with its own board which was a serious learning experience. In consequence, the foundation offers training in small business operation and in deflecting harassment while avoiding offending customers. She has had fun with the coffee company, but is fulfilled by the foundation.
