ERIC YAGER - COVID PANDEMIC UPDATE

Dr Eric Yager returned to speak to the club delivering an update on Covid 19, as the world enters the third year of the pandemic. He earned his B.Sc. in Biotechnology at the Rochester Institute of Technology and his Ph.D. in Biomedical Sciences at the University at Albany. He is an Associate Professor with a focus on Microbiology, at the Albany College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, serving as the Director of the Pre-Pharmacy Program.



Dr Yager worked from the same deck of 70+ slides which he had used last week talking to a group of professional health workers in Saratoga Springs. He offered a copy of the slides to the club for our future study. Expect their distribution by Darlene Bower.

The major topics covered included:

1. Review of the latest Covid-19 vaccine products and available data on their respective safety and efficacy.

- 2. Explain how emerging SARS-CoV-2 variants may impact vaccine efficacy and future vaccine development.
- 3. Discuss clinical considerations that guide the use COVID-19 vaccines and boosters in children and adolescents.
- Identify barriers to COVID-19 vaccine confidence and create effective communication strategies when conversing with patients about COVID-19 vaccination, particularly in children and adolescents.

A lively question and answer period followed the presentation. Some takeaways:

- 1. The pandemic continues with US deaths just short of one million to date. Eventually it will become part of the background of living, but we are not there yet.
- 2. Vaccination is very effective in preventing serious illness and death in most people and needs to be encouraged.
- 3. Get your second booster shot when eligible.
