## Karen English of the Greater Galway Food Pantry

Karen English returned to speak with us in person after a previous presentation on Zoom. The Galway Food Pantry is in the Galway Lions Building. The Galway Lions Club supports the Food Pantry with providing space, heat, and light. The pantry is open every Thursday from 10 am to 7 pm to all residents of the Galway Central School District. Currently there are 90 active families. There were 6 new families this summer.

Families qualify by meeting Federal Guidelines, but Karen stated that no one who comes with a need for food is turned away. She described special baskets of food prepared 4 times a year. There is tremendous community support with 80-90% of the sponsors from the community.

A program for the 35 active elderly (65 and older) provides \$300 toward their National Grid bill.

The Galway Food Pantry participates in the Regional Food Bank Program. The Food Bank collects large donations of food from the food industry and distributes it to charitable agencies serving hungry and disadvantaged people in 23 northeast New York counties. We learned that Dan and Sue Stec volunteer there once a week. They are a part of a team of 30 people that work 3 hours sorting and organizing the food. We also learned that food that is damaged and not fit for humans is given to a pig farmer or to a wildlife refuge agency.

Karen spoke about the food coming in various quantities. At times there are surprising shortages like "green beans". She said personal items like soap, lotions, toothpaste are items for which there is always a need. Paper goods are also a good donation.

We appreciated seeing Karen again and may take her up on an offer of a tour of the Galway Food Pantry. Information is available on Facebook. There is an opening for a volunteer on Thursday at 2:30 to 4:45pm.
