## Melanoma Education Foundation Stephen Fine

Stephen Fine, Founder and President of the Melanoma Education Foundation, joined us this evening. The Foundation was established in 2000 with a mission to educate people about melanoma. The target audience has been high school and middle school teachers and students.

Melanoma can affect those of any age from pre-teen to adult. There are just as many cases in the northern part of the country as there are in the south. He shared information about different types of skin cancer including Basal Cell Carcinoma, Squamous Cell Carcinoma, and Melanoma. He emphasized that in the early stages melanoma is easily detectable and curable. He shared visuals and information about atypical moles and normal moles. Changes in moles can be a warning of skin cancer including any

change in color, texture, size, shape, or thickness. Don't wait for itching or bleeding—this can be too late.

Stephen shared visual images of melanoma at different stages. He shared the "EFG signs" including **e**levated, firm to touch, and **g**rowing for more then two weeks. Stephen shared the importance of advocating for yourself and the saying, "when in doubt, get it out." He also shared how to check your skin, which should be done monthly. He recommends two mirrors – a wall mirror and hand mirror, hairbrush (to part your hair to check your scalp), and a light. This check only takes about ten minutes. If you find something suspicious, see a dermatologist. He recommended the foundation's website **skincheck.org** for more information.

He shared information about the sun and its radiation, with emphasis on ultraviolet light. Stephen discussed the impact and risk of tanning beds. For information about sunless tanning, visit sunless.com

He recommends sunscreen that is broadband and suggested a sun-stick for use on the face. He discussed combining sunscreen with protective clothing, sunglasses, and staying out of the sun if possible. Stephen discussed the correct application of sunscreen and information about Vitamin D.
