

## RESTORATION OF THE CHARLTON COMMUNITY CENTER JENNA SMITH AND TORBEN AABO

The club was pleased to welcome Jenna Smith, Chair, and Torben Aabo, Vice Chair, of the newlyformed Charlton Community Center Advisory Committee. The



present community center started its life as the local lodge of the Knights of Pythias, a social and service fraternity. Constructed in 1892, the building was repurposed as the Charlton Town Hall, and repurposed again as the Charlton Community Center upon the opening of new town hall east on Charlton Road. Torben reported that the building sees its most frequent use by the Charlton Seniors.

The building has experienced considerable deterioration since the town



government moved to their new facility. It sits on a wet lot and suffers from sill rot and mold in the crawl space. The restoration is estimated to cost in the range of \$600-700K. The heavy slate roof has been replaced with lighter metal roofing. The committee is developing a restoration plan, identifying sources of funding, and making recommendations to the Town Board for work to be done. Work has begun mitigating drainage issues at the road. This will improve the effectiveness of the foundation drains, and help reduce the significant water issues the building currently faces. The Town is currently pursuing a grant opportunity for approximately \$10,000 in matching funds to support this project.

The committee is pursuing a US Department of Agriculture grant of \$540K. The prospects are promising. With this funding the project could be completed by the end 2025, including structural repairs, new windows, insulation, and high-efficiency HVAC. The building will become well suited for its present use and for an emergency shelter.
