SARATOGA PLAN – Michelle Culbert

Michelle Culbert, Saratoga Plan Associate Director, opened her very interesting presentation by informing us of the organization's mission, which is "to preserve the rural character, natural habitats and scenic beauty of Saratoga County so that these irreplaceable assets are accessible to all and survive for future generations. PLAN acknowledges that the lands it conserves are ancestral homelands of Mohican, Mohawk, and Abenaki peoples." The aim is to conserve farmland, open space, woodlands, water, wetlands, and meadows in order to sustain all forms of wildlife and the healthy use of land by our citizens.

Saratoga Plan is a Land Trust bounded by the borders of Saratoga County. As a non-profit it gets no government funding. Rather, it runs on grants, foundation and private donations, a small staff, and volunteers who in 2021 donated over 3,500 hours of work.

Saratoga Plan works with communities to strike the right balance between preservation of land, and development. The Plan currently has 84 conserved lands under stewardship, of which they own 23, which totals over 7,000 acres. In 2022, there have been 41 inquiries from landowners about participation. These lands are evaluated using numerous factors, including the threat of development, in order to establish a priority list. It takes years to obtain the money to buy them, and also to work out specific details for each Conservation Easement, which are most often unique to the specific lands and owners involved.

The Plan manages 13 areas that are open for public use including 25 miles of bike trails. There is also an effort to link bike trails to establish a network of over 200 miles. They also offer events, outings, educational experiences, and Pass-Port letter boxing, based on a treasure hunt in nature.

Saratoga Plan continues to work with multiple agencies and municipalities to garner management control of thousands of acres in order to preserve natural resources, enhance economic development, and recreational opportunities.
