### Stewart's Giving – Jennifer Frame

Stewart's Shops is an American chain of 350+ convenience stores located primarily in eastern upstate New York and southwestern Vermont, owned by the Dake family and the employees through an employee stock ownership plan. Our speaker, Jennifer Frame (to right) is the firm's Director of Corporate Philanthropy.



In 2022, Stewart's Shops/Dake Family had a goal to donate \$9 million. Stewart's Shops and the two related family foundations to each donate \$3 million to thousands of local charities. The total includes the Holiday Match Program in which Stewart's matches all customer donations made in its shops from Thanksgiving Day through Christmas Day. The 2022-2023 match raised over \$2 million for local children's organizations. Stewart's customers impressively donated over \$1 million to the program. Each individual donation was matched penny for penny by Stewart's Shops. There are no administrative costs and 100% of the funds benefit local, non-profit children's organizations.

Stewart's supports organizations within its market area that focus on meeting the changing needs of recipients rather than perpetuating the status quo. They have an interest in the area of kids, their recreation and education. They do not support adult recreation groups. They value extensive volunteer support and minimum fund-raising costs, avoiding organizations that are already tax supported or have a large amount of overhead. They avoid cause-related and religious organizations, as they feel these are a matter for an individual's preference and conscience. Supported communities have more than enough specific needs, so Stewart's give to those providing a service, as opposed to those supporting a cause, contributing dollars for people rather than animals. They support local organizations that may not have as broad a base of funding or have the wide-spread emotional appeal of national health organizations. They refrain from secondary giving in which funds are given to someone, so they can in-turn give to someone else. Donations are not made directly to individuals.
