


National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Mary Beth Honsinger

NAMI, The National Alliance on Mental Illness, is a United Statesbased nonprofit organization originally founded in 1979 as a grassroots group by family members of people diagnosed with mental illness. Headquarters are in Arlington Virginia. Since its founding it has grown to over 600 local organizations with about 20 in New York State.

NAMI-NYS is the state organization of the National Alliance on Mental Illness, the nation's largest grassroots organizations that provides free support, education, and advocacy for families and individuals impacted

by mental illness and addiction issues. NAMI-NYS provides early intervention and prevention programs for students and teachers, training and programs for law enforcement and families of veterans.





NAMI employs a peer-education approach. Their programs are created and led by individuals with lived experience. A sampling follows:

<u>NAMI Connections</u> is a recovery support group for any adult who has experienced symptoms of a mental health condition. Insight is gained from hearing the challenges and successes of others. The groups are led by trained leaders who have been there. A structured model is employed to assure an opportunity to be heard.

<u>NAMI Family Support Group</u> is a free peer-led support group for any adult with a loved one who has experienced symptoms of a mental-health condition. Designed for adult loved ones of people with mental health conditions.

<u>NAMI Basics</u> is a free 6-week program for parents and caregivers of children and teens who are experiencing symptoms of a mental illness.

<u>NAMI Family-to-Family</u> is a free 8-week educational class for family members and friends of a loved one with mental illness such as depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, anxiety, and bipolar disorder.

<u>NAMI In Our Own Voice</u> is an educational presentation that offers insight into the hope and recovery that is possible for people living with mental illness. It is a 90-minute presentation given by individuals living with a mental illness. It works to change attitudes,

assumptions, and stereotypes by describing the reality of living with a mental illness.

<u>NAMI Ending the Silence</u> focuses on middle and high-school students by offering an understanding of mental illness. It is 50-minute presentation usually given in a health class.

<u>NAMI Provider Education</u> is a 5-session program for mental health professionals and staff work directly with individuals living with a mental illness and their families. Presented by a trained team to medical professionals, individuals, and family members.
